Description

A unique ancient villa in the resort town of Santa Marinella, near Rome, on the picturesque shores of the Tyrrhenian Sea.

- Private dock and boat storage.

Ancillary building:

A separate outbuilding of about 45 sq.m., which includes a living room with a kitchen, a bedroom and a bathroom for service personnel.

Historical value:

The villa has a rich history, because on its site there was once an ancient Roman villa that belonged to Senator Ulpiano. The architect who created the current building used historical artifacts, which gives special value and uniqueness to this property. 





















